Residents and homeowners of Bordentown Township are now eligible for federal assistance for damages incurred by Hurricane Irene.

On August 31, 2011 Burlington County was declared a federal disaster area by the President. As a result of that action FEMA established an office to receive applications for federal assistance by individuals and homeowners. The Disaster Recovery Center (DRC) is located in the Police Academy on the Burlington County Community College campus Route 530 Pemberton Township Burlington County. The hours are from 10:00 am to 6:00 pm Monday through Saturday.

Receiving assistance you must register with FEMA either on line or completing the appropriate forms at FEMA's DRC.

Apply online by visiting www.fema.gov or by phone by calling 1-800-621-3362. (Hearing/speech impaired ONLY) 1-800-462-7585. The following information you need ready:

- Your Social Security Number
- A description of your losses that were caused by the disaster
- Insurance information
- Directions to your damaged property
- A telephone number where you can be contacted

When you apply over the phone, the information you provide is put into a computer and an application is generated. When your application is complete, you will be provided a FEMA application Number. An inspector will follow up by calling and set an appointment to visit your home.

Types of Eligible Losses: The Individuals and Households Program (IHP) only covers repairs or replacement of items that are damaged as a direct result of the disaster that are not covered by insurance. Repairs or rebuilding may not improve your home above its pre-disaster condition unless such improvements are required by current building codes.
